# Catawba Transect 2002

Troop 19 participated in the 2002 Catawba Transect. The following letter was written by **Zach Hackley** to describe the trip....

Dear Mr. Banks;

The Catawba Transect 2002, a BSA High Adventure canoe trip down the Catawba River from Cowan's Ford Dam to Mountain Island Lake Dam was a most memorable Scouting experience. This trip was an accumulation of months of learning, preparation and planning for the following Scouts:

The trip started on the weekend of July 19<sup>th</sup> with historical and educational visits to area landmarks and facilities in Mecklenburg County (I.e. Mercy and Presbyterian Hospitals, the McIntyre Historic Site, the North Mecklenburg Recycling Center, the Energy Explorium and the Latta Plantation Nature Center)

By the beginning of the week, we had completed many requirements for the American Heritage, Energy, Electricity, Atomic Energy, Engineering, Soil & Water Conservation, Public Health and Fish & Wildlife Merit Badges. We had visited two hospitals, a food distribution plant, Latta Plantation, an energy explorium, many historical monuments, a sewage treatment plant and a water treatment plant in order to complete some of those requirements.

On Monday, we set off down the river once **Mr. Holshouser** brought the canoes to the boat ramp. We canoed down the river for several hours until we reached a cove called Duck Cove. Here we set up camp and stayed for two days. While at Duck Cove, we participated in several service projects in the area, including cleaning the trail around us and planting bean plants under the power lines for deer to eat. On



Tuesday, a visitor from the National Park Service came to us and help us earn the Forestry and Fish & Wildlife Management Merit Badges. While the visitor was there, we picked up trash all around our camping area and filled at least four trash bags.

Wednesday morning we packed our gear and canoed upstream about 300 yards where we met two men form the Division of Natural Resources. The men from the DNR discussed with us the Fish & Wildlife and Fishing Merit Badges during our visit to a wildlife refuge. Then we canoed to River Bend Steam Station and toured the plant. That night we stayed at the station and made homemade ice cream. Thursday morning we woke up and canoed to Rural Hill Farm. While at the farm, we toured the farm, walked a corn maze, worked on Justin Lewis' Hornaday project and had a **REAL** lunch. After we finished there, we canoed down to

Mountain Island Dam. There we worked on our Canoeing, Motor Boating and Water Skiing Merit Badges. We stayed there Thursday and Friday nights.

On Friday, we worked on merit badges and two Officers for the Lake Patrol came to work with us. That night we grilled hamburgers and hot dogs and ate chips and soda. On Saturday, we finished up our merit badges

and had an awards picnic with our parents. It was a very educational and enjoyable trip. I would suggest that anybody who gets the opportunity to go on it in

# United States Heritage Award Zaino

Scouts from Troop 19 recently completed a course offering for the US Heritage Award.

The troop now boasts of 12 newly certified vexillologists (one who studies flags). The class was developed and presented by Bobby Gudger to those interested in earning the award. Patriotism and excitement were rampant in the class.

The class covered a variety of materials including Red Skelton's Pledge of Allegiance, the story of the Star Spangled Banner and the

tale of Old Glory. The award emphasizes flag etiquette and teaching the participants that the flag is a living breathing entity that should be treated with the respect such an entity has earned.

The class was held the first three weeks of September which coincided with three very important dates in the US, the Pledge of Allegiance (September 8, 1892) adoption of the Constitution (September 17, 1787) and the heroes and victims of September 11, 2001. The timing allowed Mr. Gudger to stress the development of our country over the years, how patriotism and pride has developed and remained strong through our stories, songs, symbols and our hearts. The class will be offered again in September 2003.
